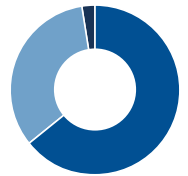

The MoA Balanced Fund employs a flexible allocation strategy. While many balanced funds are managed at a static 60/40 allocation, the Fund's portfolio managers adjust the equity/fixed income allocation depending on relative opportunities and changing market dynamics.

2 A Portfolio of High-Quality Equities and Fixed Income Securities

As active equity managers, we screen the large cap equity universe for companies with attractive valuation, capital deployment, and earnings quality characteristics.

Most of our equity portfolio investments pay dividends. We believe dividends represent a positive sign of a company's fundamental financial health. We also view dividends as a potential risk mitigator and an attractive source of incremental portfolio income.

Our fixed income portfolio consists of high-quality issuers including governments, investment grade corporates and highly rated securitized securities. Our portfolio consists primarily of AA and A rated issuers, and over 99% of the fixed income portfolio is comprised of investment grade securities (rated AAA through BBB) as of March 31, 2024.

3 Compelling Risk-Return Profile Results in Outstanding Peer Comparison

At MoA Funds, risk management is embedded in our investment process as we seek to minimize downside volatility. We are pleased that the Fund maintains an attractive risk-return profile relative to our peers in the Morningstar Moderate Allocation Category. For example, the Fund has a higher Sharpe Ratio, a measure of risk-adjusted return, relative to the category average over the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods as of March 31, 2024.

In addition, the Fund is **one of only nine funds** out of 161 unique funds in the Morningstar Moderate Allocation Category to have **top quintile (20% or better) performance for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods along with Morningstar's "Average" or "Below Average" Risk Rating for the 3-, 5- and 10-year periods** ended March 31, 2024.

The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded

funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. Among Moderate Allocation funds, the MoA Balanced Fund received 5 stars among 686 for the 3-year, 4 stars among 646 for the 5-year, and 4 stars among 487 funds for the 10-year period ended 3/31/2024. **Past performance is no guarantee of future results.**

Morningstar percentile rankings are based on a fund's average annual total return relative to all funds in the same Morningstar category.
