Consistent Fundamental Approach to Small Cap Value Investing

The employment of a consistent, repeatable investment process is the cornerstone of our investment approach. We are long-term value investors and incorporate rigorous, bottom-up research in our stock selection and portfolio construction. As small-company investors, we seek high-quality companies run by well-aligned management teams who allocate capital thoughtfully, where we can develop a differentiated view of their future prospects and can invest our investors' capital at attractive valuations.

Underappreciated High-Quality Smaller Companies

The Portfolio is comprised of generally 75 to 90 smaller high-quality companies. We tend to focus on smaller companies than our peers, which carry more potential to be underappreciated, misunderstood and inefficiently priced. Ownership of companies not widely followed by Wall Street, when actively done in a disciplined fashion with focus on our selection criteria and reasonable valuations, we believe allows investors to earn an enhanced return premium over time.

As of September 30, 2024, the Fund's average market capitalization was \$3.0B versus \$4.8B for the Morningstar Small Value Category average.

When constructing the portfolio, we seek well-positioned smaller companies that meet stringent quality criteria including:

- Strong, Experienced Management Teams
- Consistent Free Cash Flow Generation
- Disciplined Capital Deployment
- Strong Balance Sheets

Experienced Portfolio Management with High Conviction

Portfolio managers Stephen Rich and Thaddeus Pollock are tenured investment professionals with over 30 and 20 years of experience, respectively. This highly experienced team utilizes fundamental research in their high conviction selection process. As a result, the Fund tends to hold high-quality companies for 3 to 5 years or more leading to significantly lower portfolio turnover relative to the Morningstar Small Value Category average.

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The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or “star rating”, is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The Morningstar Rating does not include any adjustment for sales loads. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. Among Small Value funds, the MoA Small Cap Value Fund received 3 stars among 446 for the 3-year, 2 stars among 420 for the 5-year, and 2 stars among 326 funds for the 10-year period ended 9/30/2024. **Past performance is no guarantee of future results.**

Morningstar percentile rankings are based on a fund's average annual total return relative to all funds in the same Morningstar category. Fund performance used within the rankings, reflects certain fee waivers, without which, returns and Morningstar rankings would have been lower. The highest (or most favorable) percentile rank is 1 and the lowest (or least favorable) percentile rank is 100.

Morningstar Risk scores for a given time period (three, five, or 10 years) reflect the Fund's Morningstar risk score plotted on a bell curve: Monthly calculations are based on whether the Fund scores in the top 10% of its category, its risk score is considered High; if it falls in the next 22.5% Above Average; a place in the middle 35% is Average; those lower still, in the next 22.5%, are Below Average and the bottom Low. Overall Morningstar risk score is a weighted average of the available three, five, and 10 year Morningstar risk scores. Investments with less than three years of performance history are not rated.

The Russell 2000® Value Index measures the performance of the small-cap value segment of the U.S. equity universe. It includes those Russell 2000 companies with lower price-to-book ratios and lower forecasted growth values. It is not possible to invest in an index. Free cash flow is a company's available cash repaid to creditors and as dividends and interest to investors. Free cash flow is used as a measure of a company's financial health. Turnover is a measure of how frequently assets within a fund are bought and sold. The volume of a mutual fund's holdings that is sold and replaced with new securities annually, usually expressed as a percentage of the fund's total assets. Market capitalization (Market cap) is the total market value of all outstanding shares.
